Lee also served as Master Service-Learning Educator for the Docent Training Program for the Belmont Mansion Underground Railroad Museum and helped supporting funding efforts for that work for six years. Lee has her BA from the University of Pennsylvania, and her Masters in Education from Temple University.

"As an educator working for the School District of Philadelphia, learning that one of our students was either killed or found their way into the prison system, was always devastating. It just made educators like myself work harder to provide the resources and opportunities for our students empowering them to live brighter more productive futures," commented Lee, "I'm honored and excited to join such a worthy Board."

PLSE Executive Director Renee Chenault Fattah added, "Kathy is continuing her family's tradition of service to PLSE. Her son Michael Lee Esq, co-founded PLSE and her late husband Bernard Lee Esq. was a transformational supporter, so PLSE is grateful the Lee family's connection to PLSE continues in Kathy's new role of governance on our Board."
